I'm sure everyone remembers the original TRC LOGO which was finalised and launched in September 2015 with a huge amount of input from Mark Semczyszyn and the then Recovery College Lead, students and volunteers.

As the recovery college has evolved and grown over time (with the expansion into Wolverhampton and the community provision in Sandwell) a new identity / look was suggested and explored in 2019. Ideas and concepts were developed with our students and volunteers and the branding was co-produced and re-developed from the original TRC logo to a new concept of the Recovery College Tree logo signifying both growth of the college and the journey our students take on joining us.
